(Voice of Pope Benedict XVI in Latin – translation:) *We welcome the desire of our brother Agostino Cardinal Vallini, our vicar general for the diocese of Rome, many of our brothers in the episcopate, and of many faithful and after obtaining the opinion of the Congregation for the Causes of Saints, with our Apostolic Authority we concede that the Venerable Servant of God, John Paul II, pope, shall be called henceforth blessed and that his celebration can be held in the places under rules established by law, each year on October 22. 
